As an Assembly member, I was one of the first co-sponsors of a 1995 bill to enact marriage equality in the State of New York. When my wife and I married in 2010, we did so in Connecticut to protest New York's continued discrimination against lesbian and gay couples.

As Comptroller, I will continue my lifelong support for equality and dignity for all New Yorkers by:

- Examining City agencies' and contractors' compliance with anti-discrimination laws and policies related to sexual orientation and gender identity.
- Continuing to be an outspoken advocate of the Gender Expression Non-Discrimination Act (GENDA).
- Working with fellow City pension fund trustees to introduce shareholder resolutions to prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity, advancing LGBTQ workplace equality consistent with my fiduciary duties.

As the cradle of gay rights activism, New York City is one of the most LGBTQ friendly cities on the planet and I am honored to make this important resource available to all New Yorkers. The Guide breaks down services by interest and geographic area. In order to highlight services beyond Manhattan, the Guide includes individual maps of service providers in the Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens, and Staten Island. The Guide also includes an index to make navigation of this extensive directory that much easier.

LEGAL SERVICES

The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) community in New York has made historic gains recently with the passage of New York's Marriage Equality Act in 2011 and the U.S. Supreme Court's landmark Windsor v. United States decision, which struck down a central pillar of the discriminatory Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA). Despite this extraordinary progress, many LGBTQ individuals continue to face discrimination, harassment, and violence. A survey in that same year showed that 74 percent of respondents in New York State experienced harassment or mistreatment on the job, with 26 percent of those people losing a job due to gender or identity expression. In addition, over 37 percent of these respondents identified that in the past - they had not been hired because of their gender or identity expression.

As a result, it is vital that all LGBTQ constituents understand the legal protections and services available to them to ensure that their rights are protected. The following is a list of options for those seeking LGBTQ specific legal services in New York City.

ANTI-VIOLENCE AND HARASSMENT RESOURCES

A recent report by the National Coalition of Anti-Violence Programs (NACVP) found that anti-LGBTQ hate crimes have been on the rise in New York City for the past five years. There was a whopping 27% increase from 2012 to 2013 in the number of hate crimes experienced by LGBTQ New Yorkers. In the three years prior, the City has experienced increases of 4, 11, and 13 percent.³ It is more important than ever that those that have experienced or are currently experiencing violence and harassment can find the support they need.

New York has a range of programs and services to help LGBTQ individuals protect and preserve their general health and wellness. Indeed, health surveys have found that members of the LGBTQ community face higher rates of anxiety, substance abuse, depression and mental health challenges than the heterosexual population.⁴ The pressures of social isolation, strain in familial relationships, homophobia, transphobia and other social factors can detract from an individual's overall health and provide unique challenges for those that indentify as LGBTQ. Luckily, New York City has a number of programs and services tailored to this population.

SENIOR NEEDS

Recent estimates suggest that there are at least 1.5 million LGBTQ people aged 65 and over in the United States – a number that will double by the year 2030. In addition to the problems that many seniors deal with, LGBTQ seniors deal with a host of unique challenges. A recent study found that older same-sex couples face higher poverty rates than heterosexual couples. Not only are LGBTQ seniors more likely to be in poverty, they are also more likely to deal with stigma and discrimination in the elder care system. A recent national survey of LGBT older adults in long-term care facilities found that only 22% of respondents felt they could be open about their LGBT identities with facility staff, 89% predicted that staff would discriminate against them based on their sexual orientations and/or gender identities, and 43% reported instances of mistreatment.

Members of the LGBTQ community face a number of barriers to basic services – yet the challenges that LGBTQ individuals of color face can be even greater. Those within the Minority and LGBTQ communities are more likely to face discrimination from services and employment.¹⁰ Yet the stunning diversity of New York City has created a wide community of ethnic and minority centered services available to LGBTQ individuals looking for support and advocacy.
